RESTORATION OF KBK-BRGF

2872. SHRI BALABHADRA MAJHI:

Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government appreciates the genuine concerns of the State Governments and proposes to restore the provision for the schemes like KBK- BRGF and Integral Action Plan keeping in view the developmental needs of the most vulnerable and backward regions of States including Odisha;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the assistance provided to various States under these schemes, scheme- wise?

ANSWER

- (a) The Government appreciates the genuine concerns of the State Governments and therefore to provide greater autonomy in financing and formulating of schemes as per their need and requirement to address the regional imbalances within the States and to fill the development gaps in the deficit regions including KBK region of Odisha, the Government has accepted the recommendations of 14th Finance Commission which provides higher devolution to the States. Accordingly, the BRGF (State component) and Integrated Action Plan have become part of the higher devolution of the States.
- (b) The 14th Finance Commission share of States in the net proceeds of the union taxes has been significantly enhanced from 32% to 42% which is the biggest ever increase in vertical tax devolution/share of the States in the divisible pool which provides the sufficient flexibility to the States to conceive and implement schemes/programmes suited to the local needs and aspirations, including requirements to bridge the developmental deficit gap in backward regions within the State.

Also, as per the recommendations of the Sub-Group of Chief Ministers and consultations with various Ministries/Departments and other stakeholders, Government of India decided to rationalize the existing 66 Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) into 28 Umbrella Schemes. Further considering the development needs of the backward regions the funding pattern for the CSS in 8 North Eastern States (including Sikkim) and Himalayan States of Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir has been kept at Centre: 90% and State 10% whereas for the rest of the States this ratio has been kept at Centre: 60% and State: 40% for Core CSS. Also, the flexi-funds available in each CSS has been raised from the current level of 10% to 25% for States and 30% for UTs of the overall annual allocation under each Scheme so that the implementation can be better attuned to the local needs and requirements.

(c) Statements showing the project-wise releases made during 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 under the Special Plan for KBK Districts of Odisha, Special Plan for Bihar and Special Plan for West Bengal which were being implemented under the State Component of Backward Regions Grants Fund (BRGF) are placed at Annexure IA, Annexure IB and Annexure-IC respectively. A Statement Showing the Cumulative Releases made to the States covered under the scheme "Integrated Action Plan (IAP)/ACA for LWE Affected District is placed at Annexure –II.
