Will the Minister of SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY *विज्ञान और प्रौद्योगिकी मंत्री* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken note of recent studies suggesting the benefits of cow urine, milk, etc. as enshrined in the ancient indian texts;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the response of the Government thereto;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to set up a panel to carry out research on cow derivatives;
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor; and
- (e) the action taken/being taken by the Government to select the organizations/ institutions for projects in this regard?

- (a) Yes, Madam.
- (b) A “National Brainstorming-cum-Consultative Workshop on “Scientific Validation and Research on Panchgavya (SVAROP) was organized by Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi (IITD) in which scientists, researchers and practitioners from various academic & research institutions and agencies of the Government of India including IITs, Ministry of Science and Technology and Ministry of AYUSH besides Voluntary Organizations participated.
- (c) & (d): Government has not set up any panel to carry out research on cow derivatives. However, Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India, has constituted a National Steering Committee (NSC) to initiate a National on SVAROP Programme.
- (e) During the Brainstorming-cum-Consultative workshop held at IITD, concept ideas/ proposals related to SVAROP programme including R&D component on cow derivatives were discussed. Consequently, about 50 Research & Development (R&D) proposals have been received by IITD from various academic & research institutions besides Voluntary Organizations.
