INCLUSION OF COURSE ON DE-ADDICTION

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to start a course on de-addiction as a part of MBBS curriculum;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government also proposes to convert drug rehabilitation centres into treatment clinics; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

(c) & (d): There is no proposal to convert the de-addiction centres established under the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India to clinics. However, the Ministry through the National Drug Dependence Treatment Centre, AIIMS, New Delhi, is currently implementing a scheme called 'Establishing Drug Treatment Clinics (DTCs)'. Under this central sector scheme, Government hospitals are supported to establish and run outpatient clinics which provide comprehensive medical and psycho-social treatment to people affected by drug addiction. The list of Government Hospitals where the DTCs are currently functional is at **Annexure**.
