- (a) whether income from cultivation of many cereals and pulses has declined between 2004-05 and 2013-14 despite a considerable increase in their Minimum Support Price during this period;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the steps taken by the Government to increase the farmers income from cultivation of cereals and pulses?

(a) to (c): The return of Minimum Support Prices (MSPs) over all India weighted average all paid out cost of production including family labour (A2+FL) of major cereals and pulses for 2004-05 and 2013-14 are as under:
