No. 3789 SHRI JANARDAN SINGH SIGRIWAL:

Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of proposals received by the Government for Monorail in the country so far and the estimated cost of each project, project and State-wise including Bihar;
- (b) the details of proposals cleared and the funds sanctioned and released during the last three years and the current year, project and State-wise along with the criteria for funding;
- (c) the number of proposals still pending and the reasons for such pendency along with the time by which these pending proposals are likely to be cleared;
- (d) whether the Government proposes to establish a National Level
 Regulatory Body/ Metro Advisory Board to formulate and
 coordinate the development plan for metro projects; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and the time by which it is likely to be made functional and if not the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

- (a) to (c): Government of India (GoI) had received a proposal from Government of Tamil Nadu for granting "in-principle" approval for implementing monorail project from Poonamallee to Kathipara for 20.68 kms at an estimated cost of Rs.3,267 crores. GoI has accorded "in-principle" approval on 11.11.2014 without any financial commitment on the part of GoI. No proposal has been received from State Government of Bihar for implementation of monorail in Bihar.
- (d) & (e): Urban Transport intertwined with urban development is a State subject. Therefore, the primary responsibility for planning and development of urban transport infrastructure including metro rail network, lies with the State Government.
