INSTALLATION OF CCTV CAMERAS AT AIRPORTS

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION नागर विमानन मंत्री

be pleased to state:-

(a) whether the Union Government has any proposal to change all the existing and old CCTV cameras installed at Chennai, Coimbatore and Madurai airports;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the total number of CCTV cameras installed at these airports;

(d) the funds allocated for the above project; and

(e) the time by which the project is likely to be completed?

ANSWER

- (a) & (b): The upgradation of infrastructure at airports including, CCTV cameras is a continuous process, and airport operators upgrade the same as per requirements. Additional requirement of 400 and 57 CCTV cameras, respectively, has been assessed by Airports Authority of India (AAI) for Chennai and Madurai airports.
- (c): The number of CCTV cameras presently installed at airports in Chennai and Madurai is 651 and 41, respectively.
- (d) & (e): AAI have allocated Rs.5 Crore and Rs.0.8 Crore, respectively, for installation of additional CCTV cameras in Chennai and Madurai airports. The project is likely to be completed by end of this financial year in Chennai airport and by August, 2017 in Madurai airport.
