**SHORTAGE OF BEDS IN HOSPITALS**

**4272. DR. VIRENDRA KUMAR:**

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the ratio of hospital beds per thousand population is very low in India as compared to other developing countries;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to formulate any policy in this regard so that number of beds in hospital could be raised; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

(a) & (b): As per the provisional data of National Health Profile- 2017, compiled by the Central Bureau of Health Intelligence (CBHI), one bed in Government hospitals including Community Health Centres (CHCs) in rural and urban areas is available for average 2046 population in the Country.

However, no such data in respect of other countries is centrally maintained.

(c) & (d): Since Health is State subject, it is primarily the responsibility of the State Government to make efforts for increasing the bed strength in their Hospitals in accordance with requirement and fund availability.

However, the Central Government provides assistance to the State Governments in their efforts to provide better health care facilities to people through various schemes including under National Health Mission (NHM).

As far as three Central Government Hospitals located in Delhi viz. Safdarjung Hospital, Dr. RML Hospital and Lady Hardinge Medical College (LHMC) & Associated Hospitals are concerned, Government has approved redevelopment of Safdarjung Hospital with additional 1307 beds and LHMC with additional 570 beds.

In addition, the Central Government has also set up 6 new AIIMS at Jodhpur, Bhopal, Bhubaneshwar, Rishikesh, Raipur and Patna under Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY). Government has also taken up up-gradation of existing Government Medical Colleges.
