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## STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (c) OF LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 940 FOR ANSWER ON 21.7.2017

Defence capital acquisitions are carried out as per Defence Procurement Procedure (DPP) wherein emphasis has been given to procurement from domestic defence industry by according preference to 'Buy [Indigenously Designed, Developed and Manufactured (IDDM)]', 'Buy (Indian)', 'Buy & Make (Indian)' and 'Make' categories of capital acquisition over 'Buy (Global)' category. Any Indian company, including private company, can participate in the procurement process as per the guidelines of Defence Procurement Procedure. In the last three financial years i.e. 2014-15 to 2016-17, the Government has accorded Acceptance of Necessity (AoN) for 103 proposals worth Rs. 2,46,400 Crore approximately, in 'Buy (Indian-IDDM)', 'Buy (Indian)', 'Buy and Make (Indian)' and 'Make' categories of capital acquisition.

- 2. Some of the major policy initiatives taken by the Government to assist the domestic private sector towards acquisition of indigenous technology or from other countries are as follows:
- Indian companies are allowed for tie-ups with a foreign Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) for Transfer of Technology (ToT) under 'Buy & Make (Indian)' category.
- Under 'Buy &Make' Category of Capital Acquisition, the foreign vendor is required to transfer the Technology to Indian Production agency for indigenous production of the items. Provisions have also been made to allow Foreign OEM to select Indian Production agency of its choice for transfer of technology.
- Under chapter VII of the DPP 2016, the Government will facilitate the selected Strategic Partners (SPs) in acquisition of technology from foreign OEMs, which will be shortlisted through a transparent process.
- Defence Offset Guidelines provides for ToT to Indian Companies as one of the eligible avenues for discharge of offsets.
- Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) has issued Guidelines for ToT which provide for an institutional mechanism for transfer of technology developed by DRDO to public and private sector industry.

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
