#### **Destruction of Wildlife Habitats**

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state

- (a) whether wildlife habitats are being destroyed due to mining activities in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the existing laws to compensate the loss of forests and wild animal habitats as a result thereof;
- (c) whether the mining companies are not complying with the laws framed for the purpose; and;
- (d) if so the details thereof and the action taken by the Government against the erring companies, company-wise?

#### **ANSWER**

- (a) & (b) The Standing Committee of National Board for Wildlife considers the mining proposals falling inside the Protected Areas and within eco-sensitive zone of the Protected Areas in accordance with the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 subject to the conditions and mitigation measures imposed by the Chief Wildlife Warden during the appraisal.
- (c) & (d) The Chief Wildlife Wardens of concerned States have the responsibility of preventing encroachments / illegal mining activities in the Protected Areas across the country.
