(a) to (b) India has well laid down framework for abatement of air pollution, including environmental standards relating to emission from industries, general standards, Air Prevention and (Control of Pollution) Act, National Ambient Air Quality Standards, Network of monitoring stations and host of institutions with capability to analyze air pollution in its various dimensions. International cooperation in field of environment is ongoing process. India has not specifically sought any modern technology from any foreign country in order to reduce the increasing air pollution in the country.
