Assistance from World Bank for Pollution Free Environment

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Union Government has received any financial support from World Bank or any other Foreign Financial Institutions (FFIs) to be provided to State Government to maintain a pollution free environment;
- (b) if so, the details of the financial assistance provided to various State Governments including Tamil Nadu during the last three years and the current year, State-wise and project-wise;
- (c) whether the Capacity Building for Industrial Pollution Management Project was signed with World Bank for International Bank for Reconstruction and Development and International Development Association Credit for several Million Dollars; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof, project/State-wise including Tamil Nadu?

- (a) The Union Government has received financial support from World Bankfor Integrated Coastal Zone Management (ICZM) Programme and Capacity Building for Industrial Pollution Management Project (CBIPMP) to control pollution. Financial support has also been received from Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) for pollution abatement of rivers Mula – Mutha in Pune, Maharashtra under National River Conservation Plan (NRCP).
- (b) The details of the financial assistance provided to various State Governments during the last three years and the current year, State wise and Project wise aregiven at **Annexure.** No financial assistance has been provided to the State of Tamil Nadu.
- (c) The revised total cost of the World Bank aided CBIPM project is USD 31.054 million (Rs.201.85 crores approx.). The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) loan is US\$ 0.364 million and International Development Association (IDA) credit is US\$ 26.08 million and Government's contribution (i.e. Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and West Bengal) is US\$ 4.61 million.
- (d) Under the CBIPM project, a total of Rs. 57.80 crores, Rs. 6.00 crores and Rs. 52.29 crores has been released to Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and West Bengal respectivelyfrom the beginning of the project (2010-11)upto 26.12. 2017.
