No.2307. SHRI C. MAHENDRAN:

Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether India and Spain have signed Techno-commercial agreement to provide institutional mechanism for mutual cooperation in the field of urban transport and for construction of three Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS);
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the list of transits selected under the scheme;
- (d) whether after completion, RRTS is likely to emerge as fastest, comfortable and safe mode of transport; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) IN THE MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS (SHRI HARDEEP SINGH PURI)

(a)&(b) No, Madam. On 29 November, 2017, the National Capital Region Transport Corporation (NCRTC), which is a 50:50 joint venture company of Government of India and State

Governments of Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Haryana and Delhi, has signed an agreement with the Administrador de Infraestructuras Ferroviarias (ADIF) which is a State-owned railway organization in Spain. This agreement enables technical cooperation on railway systems for the Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) projects.

- (c) The following three prioritized RRTS corridors have been planned for implementation:
 - (i) Delhi to Meerut via Ghaziabad
 - (ii) Delhi to Alwar
 - (iii) Delhi to Panipat
- (d)&(e) RRTS being a rail based system and using state of the art technology will provide safe, comfortable and relatively faster mode of transport as compared to the existing modes.
