(a): As per available records, the details of cold storages set up in Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand under the schemes of National Horticulture Mission (NHM), National Horticulture Board (NHB) {subsumed under Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH)} and Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI) are as under:

- (b): The schemes of MIDH and MoFPI for setting up of cold storages are entrepreneur & demand driven. The funds are allocated to States on the basis of Annual Action Plan (AAP) in case of MIDH scheme and projects are approved against Expression of Interest (EoI) under MoFPI scheme.
- (c) & (d): Under MIDH scheme, assistance is provided for setting up pre-cooling units, cold room (staging) and multiple temperature and multi products cold storages for storage of perishable horticulture crops including storage of flowers for which credit linked back ended subsidy@35% of the project in general areas and @50% of the cost of project in hilly & scheduled areas per beneficiary is available.
