Water Pollution due to Idol Immersion

3048. SHRI C.S. PUTTA RAJU:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the cases of idol immersion in water bodies have seen a rise in the recent years and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the Government has undertaken any study assessing the short and long-term impact of idol immersion in water bodies;
- (c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (d) the measures taken by the Government to reduce water pollution because of idol immersion?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE (DR. MAHESH SHARMA)

- (a) There is no time series data available to indicate rise in cases of idol immersion in water bodies in the recent years.
- (b) & (C) Idol immersion may lead to adverse impact on water quality in terms of Conductivity, Total Hardness, Total Dissolved Solids, Bio-chemical Oxygen Demand, Chemical Oxygen Demand, Sulphate and concentration of heavy metalssuch as Lead, Zinc and Chromium along with depletion of Dissolved Oxygen.
- (d) The measures taken by the Government to address the environmental pollution due to idol immersion, *inter alia*, include formulation of guidelines, monitoring of pre and post immersion water quality, issuance of direction by Central Pollution Control Board, etc.
