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STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) AND (b) OF UNSTARRED QUESTION NO.784 BY SHRI M. RAJA MOHAN REDDY TO BE ANSWERED IN LOK SABHA ON 20.02.2017 REGARDING SAFETY IN RAILWAYS.

(a) & (b): Yes, Madam. A note was submitted by Dr. Bibek Debroy, Member NITI Aayog on the fund deployment framework for Rashtriya Rail Sanraksha Kosh (RRSK), wherein a reference was made to High Level Safety Review Committee (HLSRC) head by Dr. Anil Kakodkar that had suggested various measures for improving railway safety including setting up of Railway Safety Authority (RSA). Majority of the practical measures suggested by Kakodkar Committee have been implemented. However, there is no decision to create a Railway Safety Authority. An independent institution namely Commission of Railway Safety already functions under the Ministry of Civil Aviation. It discharges the functions of review/approval of safety aspects in Railways independently.

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
