**RURAL SCHEMES FOR DIFFERENT SECTORS**

**949. SHRI P. KARUNAKARAN:**

Will the Minister of **RURAL DEVELOPMENT** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the need of different schemes and programmes for different sectors is being felt for the development of rural areas in the country in line with the changing economy at international level presently and if so, the details thereof
- (b) whether the Government has drawn up draft proposal for implementation in this regard; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof?

**ANSWER**

(a) : Keeping in view the need for the holistic development of rural areas, including the need for employment generation, strengthening of livelihood opportunities, promotion of self-employment, skilling requirement of rural youths, provision for social assistance and other basic amenities, the Ministry of Rural Development, inter alia, is implementing Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM), Deen Dayal Upadhyay – Gramin Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY), Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana – Gramin (PMAY-G), Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) and National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP) through State Governments/ UT Administrations. The Ministry constantly reviews the implementation of its programmes and takes necessary actions whenever it is felt that there is need for some changes in the scheme architecture or there is a need for inclusion of some new provisions under the schemes with the changing economic scenario.

(b) & (c): As the implementation of current schemes/programmes of the Ministry, along with the programmes implemented by other Ministries in rural areas, covers all aspects of development of rural areas, there is no proposal to formulate different schemes and programmes.
