- (c) whether the demonetisation and increase in digital transaction and increase in digital transaction has led to the decline in demand for coins and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the steps taken by the Government to ensure that coins of all denominations are freely available in the market?

- (a) & (b) There is no plan to stop the production of coins. The production of ₹10 coins has been halted temporarily as adequate stocks are available.
- (c) & (d) There is no perceptible decline in demand of coins in India. Sufficient stocks of coins are available to meet public demand. RBI and banks are taking all measures to ensure availability of coins to public across the counters and through coin melas etc.
