- (c) whether the Government has framed guidelines for such banks and if so, the details thereof?

- There are some breast milk banks established under private and government establishments in the country.
- Detailed information on private milk banks is not available. However, National Government has supported for establishment of one milk bank in West Bengal and 10 milk banks in Tamil Nadu as innovation projects under National Health Mission (NHM).

(b) & (c)

• The Government has released the "National Guidelines on establishment of Lactation Management Centres in public health facilities" in June 2017. This is a guiding document for setting up of comprehensive lactation management services that includes establishment of "Comprehensive Lactation management Centres (CLMCs)" in large District Hospitals and Medical Colleges for improving access to human milk for sick newborns and infants admitted in these Government hospitals.
