Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has accorded extreme priority to the construction of Delhi-Jaipur Expressway;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the amount spent on the said project;
- (c) the time by which work is likely to be completed on the said project;
- (d) whether the Government has increased the budget for construction of flyovers;
- (e) if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) the details of other projects connecting Delhi with various parts of Rajasthan along with the timelines for their completion and funds allocated to such projects?

ANSWER

- (a) to (e) Earlier, Government of India had approved plan for construction of Expressways under NHDP Phase-VI which included Delhi-Jaipur Expressway. Recently, Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) has approved Bharatmala Pariyojana Phase-I which envisages construction of Delhi-Jaipur Expressway also. An Outlay of Rs. 40,000.00 has been made for construction of 800 kms Expressway under Bharatmala Pariyojana Phase-I. The details such as project starting date, scheduled completion time, estimated project cost and details regarding budget for construction of flyovers of Delhi-Jaipur Expressway cannot be stated until the feasibility is finalized and proposal is approved by the Competent Authority.
- (f) Other National Highway Project connecting Delhi with Rajasthan (Jaipur) is 8-laning of Delhi-Gurgaon (completed) and 6-laning of Gurgaon –Kotputli-Jaipur section of NH-8. The work of 6-laning of Gurgaon –Kotputli-Jaipur section of NH-8 on BOT(Toll) mode is at construction stage and progress as on date is 95%. The project is likely to be completed by June, 2018. Govt. of India has approved one-time fund infusion of Rs. 352 cr in this project in 2016.
