## **CHINESE THREAT IN INDIAN WATERS**

3183. PROF. K.V. THOMAS:

Will the Minister of DEFENCE j{kk ea=h be pleased to state:

(a) whether Naval Chiefs of Quadrilateral Nations, i.e. U.S., India, Australia and Japan, have called China a disruptive power;

(b) if so, whether Chinese Navy had made big changes to its deployment pattern in the waters of India; and

(c) if so, the steps the Government has taken to meet this Chinese threat in Indian waters?

## ANSWERMINISTER OF STATE(DR. SUBHASH BHAMRE)IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCEरारायमंी(डा. सुभाष भामरे)

(a) No such statement has been made by the Chief of Naval Staff of India.

(b) & (c): Government is aware of China's stated objective of becoming a 'maritime power'. As part of this strategy, China is undertaking maritime activities and developing ports and other infrastructure facilities in the littoral countries in the Indo-Pacific region, including in the vicinity of India's maritime boundary.

Government keeps a constant watch on all developments having a bearing on India's security and takes all necessary measures to safeguard it.
