(a) whether the Government proposes to launch a course to be undertaken by the renowned institutions under the Ministry to study state-of-art of remote sensing and GIS mapping to address the challenges rising in rapidly changing urban environment of Indian cities;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) the steps taken by the Government in this regard?

(a) to (c): Higher Educational Institutions like Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) and National Institutes of Technology (NITs) etc. have academic autonomy to frame and transact their curriculum/course in various programmes including remote sensing and GIS mapping. Further, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has constituted an Expert Committee to examine as to how geospatial education could be integrated in the existing University system and its implication in other areas like engineering, IT etc. and to highlight its benefits in areas like developing smart cities, urban planning etc.
