Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the National Council for Teachers Education (NCTE) has withdrawn recognition from thousands of teacher education institutes in the recent past;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the reasons therefor, State-wise; and
- (c) the steps taken by the Government to make available names of the recognized Teacher Education Institutes on the website of NCTE for information of students seeking admission in recognized institutes and also to shutdown unrecognized institutions?

ANSWER

- (a) & (b): During the academic session 2016-2017, the NCTE had withdrawn recognition of 133 institutions offering various Teacher Education Programmes (TEPs) for not following the guidelines stipulated in the NCTE, Act, Rules and Norms and Standards. A state-wise list of institutions is attached at Annexure-I
- (c): The list of recognized institutions as well the list of withdrawn institutions is available on the website of the concerned Regional Committee (s) and NCTE Headquarters which is updated regularly.
