SETTING UP OF COLD STORAGES

5189. SHRI LAKHAN LAL SAHU:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any scheme has been formulated by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare and Ministry of Food Processing Industries to protect various kinds of agriculture produce by constructing cold storages, State/district-wise, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the Government provides any loan in this regard and if so, the criteria thereof;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to take/ has taken any concrete steps in this regard; and
- (d) if so, the number of cold storages constructed by the Government as well as by the private parties through personal loans in the country, State-wise, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्रालय में राज्य मंत्री (SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA)

- (a): Government of India is implementing Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) and Pradhan Mantri Kissan SAMPADA Yojana under which assistance is available for establishment of cold storage/cold chain. State/UT wise details of cold storages established in the country are at **Annexure I**.
- (b) to (d): Government does not provide loan for setting up of cold storages. Loan is provided by Banks/Financial Institutions for setting up of Cold Storages.

Under MIDH, the component of cold storage is demand/entrepreneur-driven from among entrepreneurs, private companies, cooperatives, farmers groups etc. through commercial ventures for which assistance @35% of admissible project cost in general areas and @50% in hilly and schedule area is available as credit linked and back ended subsidy.

Further, under SAMPADA scheme of Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI) financial assistance is available in the form of grant-in-aid @ 35% for general areas and @ 50% for North East States, Himalayan States, Integrated Tribal Development Projects (ITDP) areas and Islands for storage and transport infrastructure and @ 50% and 75% respectively for value addition and processing infrastructure subject to a maximum grant-in-aid of Rs. 10 crore for setting up integrated cold chain projects including irradiation facility. Under this scheme integrated cold chain and preservation infrastructure can be set up by individuals, groups of entrepreneurs, cooperative societies, Self Help Groups (SHGs), Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), NGOs, Central/State PSUs, etc. The scheme is primarily private sector driven and proposals under this scheme are invited through Expression of Interest (EOI) by MoFPI. The scheme is available in rural & urban areas in all States/UTs.
