VACANCIES IN STATE POLICE

†5229. SHRI KAPIL MORESHWAR PATIL:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether a large number of posts are vacant in police departments in various States of the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;

(c) the number of vacancies in police department, State and UT-wise including Maharashtra and other States affected by violence;

(d) whether the Government has made any suggestion to the States and police departments in this regard;

(e) if so, the details thereof along with the reaction of the States and police departments thereto; and

(f) the additional steps taken by the Government to fill all the vacancies in the States especially the States affected by communal violence, revolt and naxalism in a time bound manner?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI HANSRAJ GANGARAM AHIR)

(a) & (b): Yes Madam. As per data compiled by Bureau of Police Research

& Development (BPR&D), as on 1.1.2017, there are 4,43,524 vacant posts

in police departments in all the States and Union Territories, against the

total sanctioned strength of 19,89,295.

The vacancies in the service are caused due to factors such as retirement, resignation, death etc. All these factors are recurring in nature.

(c): The details of the number of vacancies in police department, State and UT-wise is given at Annexure-I.

(d) to (f): As 'Police' is a State subject falling in List-II of seventh schedule of the Constitution of India, it is primarily the responsibility of the State Governments to fill all the vacancies posts in their respective State in time bound manner. The Centre advises the States from time to time for taking requisite action in this regard.

Further, the issue of vacancies in police forces of 10 Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected States is regularly monitored by the Government. Recently the matter has been reviewed by the Cabinet Secretary as well as the Union Home Minister and States have been advised to take suitable action for filling up the vacancies.
