Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether due to traffic jams in Delhi and other metro cities, traffic is getting slower day by day and is causing great inconvenience to the passengers;**
- (b) if so, whether the Government has decided to install Intelligent Traffic Signal Management System in Delhi;**
- (c) if so, the details thereof along with the expenditure likely to be involved in this regard;**
- (d) the time by which the said Intelligent Traffic Signal Management System is likely to be installed in Delhi; and**
- (e) the steps taken/being taken by the Government to install such type of system in other metro cities and Union Territories?**

- (a) to (e): Delhi Police has reported that the number of motor vehicles on Delhi Roads are growing and as a result, problem of traffic congestion/ jam**

on roads is faced in several parts of Delhi. As regard other metro cities, States and Urban Local Bodies are taking necessary initiatives including planning and execution of urban transport systems being the State subject in terms of Entry 13 of the State List of the Constitution of India.

In respect of UT of Delhi, ITMS (Intelligent Traffic Management System) is envisaged by Delhi Police to provide technology based traffic solutions and enforcement so as to improve mobility, discipline and safety on the roads of Delhi. Approval of Competent Authority for hiring of Consultant by Delhi Police for preparation of Detailed Project Report (DPR) of ITMS and for implementation support has been conveyed to Delhi Police.
