INFECTION IN MEDICAL TOURISTS

1863. SHRI R. PARTHIPAN:

Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the country's medical tourism market may suffer a setback due to the emergence of Carbapenem-resistant enterobacteria infections in medical tourists from the USA recently;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has taken proper prophylactic and preventive measures in this regard to protect/safeguard the tourism industry; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TOURISM (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) (SHRI K.J. ALPHONS)

- (a) and (b): The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has informed that emergence of Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) including Carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteria, is a growing challenge not only in India but globally. However, no specific information regarding setback to medical tourism in this regard has been reported to this Ministry so far.
- (c) and (d): Government of India has launched a National Programme on Containment of Anti- Microbial Resistance (AMR) in the country. The Programme aims to generate data on Anti-Microbial Resistance Patterns and to recommend and coordinate various actions to prevent the emergence of AMR in the Country.
