- (b) the details of the number of accidents happened at these unmanned crossings during the last three years and the current year, zone-wise and the persons died in these accidents;
- (c) the policy laid down for payment of compensation and the total compensation paid to the next of kin of those died in these accidents during the last three years, zone-wise and year-wise;
- (d) whether the Government is planning/proposing to construct over bridges/underpass at these crossings or the Government has received any proposal in this regard from some of the States; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and the time by which it is likely to be constructed?

(a): The number of unmanned level crossings (UMLCs) on Broad Gauge (BG), Meter Gauge (MG) and Narrow Gauge (NG), as on 01.04.2018 is as follows:

There are 314 UMLCs in the State of West Bengal in which 147 are on BG and 167 on NG. There are no UMLCs on MG in the State of West Bengal.

(c): As per provisions of Section 124 and 124A of the Railways Act, 1989, Railways are liable to pay compensation for death of a passenger in a train accident or untoward incident. As such, Railways are not liable to pay compensation for loss of life of the road users for accidents at UMLCs, under the Railways Act, 1989. However, next of kin of deceased can file a claim for compensation in Motor Accident Claims Tribunal (MACT). Railway administration is liable to pay compensation only when a decree is awarded by Hon'ble MACT in favour of the claimant and Railway decides to implement the decree.

The amount of compensation paid to the next of kin of those died in accidents at UMLCs during the last three years is as follows:

Note:- The compensation paid in a year need not necessarily relate to the accidents/casualties in that year alone. This amount depends upon the number of cases which are finalized in a particular year irrespective of the year(s) in which the accident they pertain to, have occurred.

(d) & (e): The unmanned level crossings (UMLCs) on Broad Gauge (BG) are targeted for elimination by March 2020. However efforts are being made to eliminate all UMLCs on BG even earlier also. It is the endeavor of Railways

to eliminate all unmanned level crossings in a phased manner by either of the following:-

- Closure Closing unmanned level crossings having NIL/ negligible Train
 Vehicle Unit (TVU).
- Merger Merger of unmanned level crossing gate to nearby manned/unmanned level crossing or subway/Road Under Bridge (RUB)/Road Over Bridge (ROB) by construction of diversion road.
- Provision of Subways/RUBs.
- Manning- Manning of unmanned level crossings which cannot be eliminated by above means.

The UMLCs on MG and NG will be eliminated during Gauge conversion.

Railways has not received any proposal for elimination of UMLC from any of the State Govt.
