#### Demand for coal

#### 29. DR. P. VENUGOPAL:

Will the Minister of COAL be pleased to state:

- (a) whether even in the most adverse scenario, as of second quarter of 2017, it appears that the demand for coal in India, as a source of primary energy, shall expand until 2030 and perhaps beyond, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether this would be at lower compound annual growth rate of 3 per cent compared to 6 per cent in the last five years; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof?

### **ANSWER**

## MINISTER OF RAILWAYS, COAL, FINANCE & CORPORATE AFFAIRS (SHRI PIYUSH GOYAL)

(a)to(c):Yes, Madam. As per study report of M/s KPMG Advisory Services entrusted for formulating "Coal Vision 2030" for coal sector by Coal India Limited (CIL), as of second quarter of 2018, it appears that the demand for coal in India, as a source of primary energy, shall expand until 2030 and perhaps beyond. The report estimates overall coal demand to be 1300-1900 MT by 2030.

As per Coal Vision 2030, in the long term, the overall coal demand is expected to reach 1.46 BT by 2030 at a CAGR of 4.2% from 2020 as compared to a CAGR of 5.4% achieved in actual demand during the last five years (from 2013-14 to 2017-18).

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
