Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the education grants sanctioned/released by the Government to various educational institutions for higher education during each of the last three years and the current year, institution- wise;
- (b) whether the Government to channelise a portion of education infra grants as loans via the Higher Education Funding Agency (HEFA);
- (c) if so, the details along with the aims and objectives thereof;
- (d) the details of the funds raised by the HEFA for this purpose; and
- (e) the steps taken/being taken by the Government to check hike in fee in higher education?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

(DR. SATYA PAL SINGH)

- (a): The details may be seen at Annexure.
- (b) to (d): The Government has approved "Revitalising Infrastructure and Systems in Education by 2022", as per which funding of educational infrastructure for higher, school and medical education institutions would be carried out through Higher Education Financing Agency (HEFA). The total authorized equity capital of HEFA has been raised to Rs.10,000 crore from Rs.2000 crore to meet the enlarged scope of funding obligations, with the facility to leverage

additional resources from the market, based on requirement. An additional Government equity of Rs.5,000 crore, apart from the existing Rs. 1,000 crore has been approved. All funds for educational infrastructure in centrally funded educational institutions will henceforth be in the form of ten year loans through HEFA to the institution, the interest liability of which would be borne by the Government. The principal repayment would be undertaken by the institutions in part or full depending on their age profile and financial capability. For new institutions and those which have limited fee revision options, the entire principal and interest repayment would be undertaken by the Government. There is an additional window of financing for school and medical education institutions where the sponsoring Department would undertake to repay the principal and interest to HEFA. The objective of RISE by 2022 is to establish high-end educational infrastructure in the country in a fast tracked manner so that students get access to quality education, the process of brain drain is reversed and the demographic dividend of the country is realized.

(e): The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) had constituted a Committee under the Chairmanship of Justice B.N. Srikrishna, former Judge of Hon'ble Supreme Court to recommend the fee to be charged by private technical institutes in the country. The committee has recommended maximum limit of tuition and development fee to be charged by these institutions. These recommendations have been incorporated in AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2018-19. Further all the State/ UT Governments have been directed to comply with the recommendations of the Fee Committee. Accordingly, State/ Fee Regulatory Committees have been constituted to fix the limit of tuition and development fee to be charged by these institutions. As of now there is no UGC regulation on fee structure.
