- (e) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken by the Government to check such rising trend of MiG fighter crashes?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (e) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 204 FOR ANSWER ON 26.12.2018

A total number of two MiG aircraft of the Indian Air Force (IAF) have crashed in the last six months. There was one casualty of service personnel in these accidents. The compensation will be paid after the Court of Inquiry is finalized.

The factors responsible for these crashes will be known, once Court of Inquiry is completed.

Each aircraft accident in the IAF is investigated through a Court of Inquiry and remedial measures are undertaken accordingly to check their recurrence in future. Besides, a continuous and multi-faceted effort is always underway in the IAF to enhance and upgrade flight safety. Measures to enhance the quality of training to improve the skill levels, ability to exercise sound judgment and situational awareness of pilots are being pursued. Constant interaction with Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) is also maintained for enhancement of aerospace safety. In addition, various bird hazard management measures are also undertaken.
