Will the Minister of **RURAL DEVELOPMENT** be pleased to state:

- (a) the salient features and the current status of the implementation of the Start-up Village Entrepreneurship Programme (SVEP);
- (b) the details regarding the number of blocks that have been identified by the Government for the implementation of the said programme, State/UT-wise;
- (c) the number of village enterprises that have been set up since the inception of the said programme;
- (d) the total number of jobs created thereunder since inception, State/year-wise and the number of States covered under the said programme; and
- (e) whether the Government proposes to involve all other States and if so, the details thereof along with the quantum of funds allocated/utilised since the inception of the said programme, year-wise?

STATEMENT (a) to (e) REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. *233 TO BE ANSWERED ON 27.12.2018.

(a) to (e): Start-up Village Entrepreneurship Programme (SVEP), the sub-scheme under Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM) has the objective of helping members of Self Help Group (SHG) and their family members to set-up small enterprises in the non-farm sector. The salient features of the programme are:

- (i) SVEP aims to support rural entrepreneurs by developing an eco-system for supporting small businesses in rural areas.
- (ii) The eco-system comprises of a cadre of Community Resource Persons - Enterprise Promotion (CRP-EP) who provides business support services to entrepreneurs.
- (iii) A dedicated fund called Community Enterprise Fund (CEF) is set-up to provide seed capital for enterprises.
- (iv) A Block Resource Centre (BRC), the dedicated centre at the block level for supporting enterprise promotion is established in each block.
- (v) An exclusive team comprising of block anchors, mentors and Block Programme Managers (BPM) - SVEP at the block level with a clear understanding of business dynamics and entrepreneurship helps in implementing SVEP.

The blocks for implementation of SVEP are identified by the respective State Government and not by the Central Government. SVEP, as on 30th November, 2018 is being implemented in 131 blocks across 20 States. The State-wise details of number of blocks where programme is being implemented is provided in **Annexure-I**.

Enterprise formation has started in 51 blocks across 17 States and 30,352 enterprises have been formed as on 30th November, 2018.

It is estimated that as on 30th November 2018, the 30,352 SVEP enterprises have created employment for 62,829 persons. The State wise details are provided in the **Annexure - II**.

All State Rural Livelihoods Missions (SRLMs) have been oriented about the programme and have been requested to submit proposals for SVEP through the supplementary Annual Action Plans (AAP).

SVEP does not have a State wise allocation of funds. Funds are released to the States/UTs on the basis of Supplementary Action Plan submitted by States/UTs and duly approved by the Empowered Committee of the ministry. Funds are released in three instalments of 25%, 50% and 25% for implementation of the scheme. The funds released to the States/UTs year-wise is provided at **Annexure – III**.
