### SHORTAGE OF AYUSH DOCTORS AND PARAMEDICAL STAFF IN GOVERNMENT HOSPITALS

#### 1925. SHRI LAKHAN LAL SAHU:

Will the Minister of AYURVEDA, YOGA AND NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (AYUSH) be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is acute shortage of AYUSH Doctors and Paramedical Staff in Government Hospitals;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of vacant posts of AYUSH doctors, State/UT-wise including Chhattisgarh;
- (d) whether the Government has assessed the treatment of patients done through AYUSH system of Medicine in different hospitals including AIIMS, New Delhi during the last three years; and
- (e) the other steps taken by the Government to meet the shortage of AYUSH Doctors?

#### **ANSWER**

# THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYURVEDA, YOGA & NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (SHRI SHRIPAD YESSO NAIK)

- (a) to (c): As Health is a State subject the information on shortage of AYUSH doctors, paramedical staff and vacant posts in Government hospitals State/UT-wise including Chhattisgarh is not maintained by the Central Government.
- (d): No such assessment has been made with regard to patient treated through AYUSH system of medicines in various hospitals.
- (e): Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National AYUSH Mission (NAM), the components for setting up of 50 bedded integrated AYUSH Hospitals and upgradation of standalone AYUSH Hospitals are having provisions for contractual deployment of AYUSH doctors in the Government hospitals under States/UTs. In this regard, the State/UT Governments are required to submit their proposal through the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) as per the guidelines of the scheme.
