#### **Teacher's Vacancies in Rajasthan**

#### †2106.SHRI DEVJI M. PATEL:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is true that as per the Right to Education forum more than five lakh posts of teachers are vacant in India including Rajasthan whereas about 6.6 lakh teachers require training;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise;
- (c) the total number of vacant positions of teachers and principals in Kendriya Vidyalayas and Navodaya Vidyalayas across the country including Jalore; and
- (d) the steps taken by the Government to fill up these vacancies?

#### **ANSWER**

### MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. SATYA PAL SINGH)

(a) to (d): States and UTs including Rajasthan have reported vacancy of 5,30,252 teachers in their Annual Work Plan & Budget (AWP&B) for year 2018-19. Number of vacant posts of teachers in States and UTs are at Annexure.

In Kendriya Vidyalayas 474 posts of Principals/Vice Principals and 8,467 posts of teachers as on 01<sup>st</sup> November, 2018 and in Navodaya Vidyalayas 128 posts of Principals and 2,218 posts of teachers as on 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2018 are vacant across the country including Jalore, Rajasthan.

The recruitment, service conditions and deployment of teachers are regulated by the respective State/UT Government. Ministry of Human Resource Development has advised all the State Governments for filling-up the vacant posts of teacher and their rational deployment including in rural areas. The Central Government through erstwhile scheme of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) at elementary level

provided assistance to the State Governments and UTs for additional teachers to maintain appropriate pupil teacher ratio as per the RTE norms.

Proviso to section 23 (2) of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 has been amended vide RTE (Amendment) Act, 2017, to enable the appropriate Government to ensure that every teacher appointed or in position as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2015, who does not possess minimum qualifications as laid down by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), acquires the qualifications by 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2019. The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) has been entrusted to conduct this training through ODL (Open Distance Learning) mode. 13,78,935 number of teachers from private, government and government aided schools have registered for the course.
