BACKLOG OF TRACK RENEWAL

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Railways require additional tracks to clear track renewal backlog;
- (b) if so, the details of annual requirement of the railways;
- (c) the number of railway tracks required by the Railways for 2018-19 and the extent to which the SAIL is likely to be capable to provide railway tracks;
- (d) whether the railways has placed an order on Jindal Steel and Power Ltd. to supply one lakh tonne railway track as a part of global tender;
- (e) if so, the details thereof and the extent to which the Jindal Steel and Power Ltd. is likely to fulfil this demand of the railways; and
- (f) the steps taken by the Government to meet the requirement of railways to clear the backlog of track renewal and doubling of track?

ANSWER

(a) & (b) Yes, Madam. Based on assessment and sanctioned work as on

01.04.2018, Target and Annual requirement for renewal of existing Rails over Indian Railways in 2018-19 is 9.54 lakh Metric Ton of Rails.

(c) Requirement of rails for renewal of existing running lines and construction of new lines/doubling/Gauge conversion over Indian Railways during 2018-19 is 16.66 lakh Metric Ton.

Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL) has committed to supply 10 lakh tons of rails to Indian Railways in 2018-19. From April, 2018 to November, 2018, SAIL has supplied 5.61 lakh tons of rails.

- (d) & (e) Yes, Madam. A developmental order has been placed on M/s Jindal Steel & Power Ltd (M/s JSPL) for 97,400 Metric Ton rails to be supplied by August, 2019. M/s JSPL has supplied 43,000 Metric Ton rails till 30.11.2018.
- (f) Following steps have been taken to address the problem of shortage of rails:
- (i) Development Order for supply of rails have been given to M/s JSPL, as detailed above.
- (ii) Permission for import of rails has been sought from Ministry of Steel.
