Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken any steps to implement the recommendations of the report "National Requirement of Manpower for 8 hours shift in Police stations" published by the Bureau of Police Research and Development in 2014;
- (b) if so, the steps taken towards implementation of the same;
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor along with the efforts being made to implement the same; and
- (d) the details of police departments and police commissionerates which have introduced the 8 hour shift system, Statewise?

ANSWER

(a) to (d): The Bureau of Police Research and Development sponsored a research project titled 'National Requirement of Manpower for 8-Hour Shifts in Police Stations' to the Administrative Staff College of India, Hyderabad. The said research project was successfully completed and a copy of the report alongwith an executive summary was forwarded to all the States/ UTs. "Police" is State subject as per Entry 2 of List II of the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution. Accordingly, the responsibility to implement the various police reforms measures rests with the respective State Govt./UTs Administration.
