#### 4376. SHRI MAHEISH GIRRI:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken any steps to eradicate the trafficking of women in Delhi;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has taken any steps to bring in 33% reservation for women in Police Force; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

#### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI HANSRAJ GANGARAM AHIR)

- (a) & (b): Delhi Police have inter-alia taken the following steps to address the problem of trafficking of women in NCT of Delhi:
- (i) Keeping vigil at locations prone to trafficking, especially at highways, dhabas, railway station, bus stations etc. and monitoring the movement of strangers at those places.
- (ii) Running public awareness campaigns, involving agencies/NGOs concerned to undertake empowerment programmes etc.

- (iii) Prevention at transit area, such as railway junctions, bus stops, etc. by appropriate intervention.
- (iv) Prevention in areas prone to sex tourism, crime under the facade of massage parlours, cyber pornography, etc.
- (v) Migrants coming from Nepal to Delhi are made aware of trafficking issues, safe migration, Human rights, women and child rights with the help of brochures etc.
- (vi) Developing/ sharing comprehensive database and intelligence about traffickers/ exploiters.
- (vii) Regular review of Anti Human Trafficking activities in the monthly crime meetings to ensure that Human Trafficking crimes are investigated thoroughly and professionally.
- (viii) Short listing and mapping target/vulnerable geographic areas and situations to ensure concerted action.

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has also issued various advisories to States and UTs from time to time. These advisories are available at MHA's website: <a href="www.mha.gov.in">www.mha.gov.in</a>. Financial assistance is also provided to State Governments and UTs to hold Judicial Colloquiums and State Level Conferences on Human Trafficking for sensitizing the judicial officers on

procedures for speedy disposal of trafficking cases and to bring awareness among the various law enforcement agencies/ other stakeholders in this regard.

(c) & (d): On 20.3.2015, the Ministry of Home Affairs approved 33% reservation for women horizontally and in each category (SC, ST, OBC and others) in direct recruitment in Non-Gazetted posts from Constable to Sub-Inspector in Police Forces in all Union Territories

As 'Police' is a State subject under the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India, the Ministry of Home Affairs has written a letter to Chief Secretaries of all States on 22.4.2013 advising them to increase the representation of women in police force to 33%.
