### ANSWER

India is the largest producer of cotton in the world. State-wise details of (a) & (b): production of cotton in the country during each of the last three years i.e. 2015-16 to 2017-18 is given at Annexure.

(c) & (d): Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers Welfare is implementing Cotton Development Programme under National Food Security Mission - Commercial Crops (NFSM-CC) for enhancing productivity and production w.e.f. 2014-15 in 15 States viz., Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal. Under this scheme thrust has been given on transfer of technology through frontline demonstration and training in order to extend benefits to the farmers. NFSM is implemented on a 60:40 sharing basis between Government of India and States for general category states and 90:10 basis for North East and hilly states.

Besides NFSM, the States can support cotton development programme under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) with the approval of State Level Sanctioning Committee (SLSC) chaired by the Chief Secretary of the State.

Further to provide remunerative prices to cotton cultivators in the country, Government has fixed the Minimum Support Price (MSP) of Cotton for 2018-19 season at Rs.5150/- per quintal for medium staple and at Rs. 5450/- per quintal for long staple. This provides margin of 50 percent over all India paid out cost including family labour.
