Frequent Changes in Syllabus

948. SHRI PARVESH SAHIB SINGH:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is of the opinion that frequent changes in syllabus of primary education by the Central Government causes negative effect on the graph of student's learning and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the Government plans to bring any measures for making frequent changes in syllabus and if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the details of changes made in syllabus by NCERT during the last five years?

(a) to (c) The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) develop the syllabus for the elementary and higher secondary classes as a follow up to National Curriculum Framework (NCF), 2005. The NCERT has not made any change in the syllabus in last five years. However, the NCERT updates its textual material in terms of content and data while bringing out the reprint editions, wherever required.
