*95. SHRI ABHISHEK SINGH:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of steps taken by the Government to ensure availability of decent medical facilities in remote regions of the country;
- (b) the current status of the Ayushman Bharat Scheme;
- (c) whether the Government is aware of the problems in the scheme faced due to its complex software and if so, the remedial steps taken in this regard; and
- (d) whether Ayushman Bharat health protection scheme covers the lodging and boarding charges required for the attendant accompanying the patient during the treatment period of the beneficiary and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA)

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.95* FOR 8TH FEBRUARY, 2019

(a) The National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) was launched in 2005 to supplement the efforts of the State/UT governments to provide accessible, affordable and quality healthcare to all especially the vulnerable population. NRHM has been subsumed as a Sub Mission of the overarching National Health Mission (NHM) with the National Urban Health Mission being the other Sub Mission. Under NHM support is being provided to States/ UTs for strengthening of their healthcare system including support for quality medical facilities in remote regions of the country.

The Government has launched Ayushman Bharat Programme to address access to health holistically, including prevention, health promotion, primary, secondary and tertiary care. Ayushman Bharat Yojana comprises of two components namely (i) Provision of Comprehensive Primary Healthcare (CPHC) through Health and Wellness Centers (HWCs) and (ii) Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY).

Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY) provides hospitalisation coverage up to Rs.5.00 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary care procedures including certain defined pre and post hospitalisation expenses to families eligible based on specified deprivation and occupational criteria as per Socio Economic Caste Census Database.

Health and Wellness Centres are envisaged to provide an expanded package of primary healthcare services encompassing reproductive and child health services, communicable diseases, non-communicable disease, palliative care and elderly care, oral health and ENT care, and basic emergency care in addition to preventive care and health promotion, provision of point of care diagnostics, regular refills of essential drugs etc.

The Central Government has also released broad guidelines for private investment in setting up of hospitals in tier 2 and tier 3 cities. These guidelines provide for interventions like land allotment, time bound clearances and viability gap funding up to 40% of project cost.

- 82 district hospitals are being upgraded to government medical colleges with Central Government's assistance in underserved areas of the country. In addition to this, new super specialities are being set up in 73 government medical colleges under Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY).
- (b) As on 04.02.2019, Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for implementation of Ayushman Bharat PMJAY has been signed with 33 States and UTs with only exception of Delhi, Odisha and Telangana. Implementation of PMJAY has already started in 29 States and UTs. As on 04.02.2019 the total number of hospitals empanelled under PMJAY is 14,440, out of these, 7118 are public hospitals. The current status of ABPMJAY is provided at Annexure.

As regards Health and Wellness Centres (HWCs), approvals for over 21000 such Centres was accorded in 2018-19 against the target of 15000 in the current year. Out of these 8120 Health & Wellness Centres have been operationalized so far.

- (c) No such issue has been reported to the Government.
- (d) The lodging and boarding charges for attendant accompanying the patient during the treatment are not covered in the design of PMJAY.
