Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of schemes launched by the Government under the Ministry of Women and Child Development since 2014 till date along with the details of the targets set and the achievements made under each of the said schemes, year and State/UT-wise including Bihar and Haryana;
- (b) the details of the proposals received from various States along with the proposals approved by the Government under the schemes sponsored by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, State/UT-wise;
- (c) the details of the funds allocated, released and utilized for implementation of various schemes of this Ministry during each of the last four years and the current year, scheme and State/UT-wise;
- (d) whether the released funds have been utilised properly by the State Governments and if so, the details therefor and if not, the reasons thereof along with the steps taken by the Government to ensure full and proper utilization of the released funds; and
- (e) whether the Government has set any time limit for completing the pending schemes and if so, the schemes under which the work has been completed or is near completion and if not, the reasons therefor?

**ANSWER**

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT  
(DR. VIRENDRA KUMAR)

- (a) to (e): The details of schemes launched by the Government since 2014 across the country including Bihar and Haryana are as follows:
  - (i) Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) has been contributing towards better enabling environment by providing cash incentives of Rs. 5,000/- in three installments for improved health and nutrition to pregnant and nursing mothers. The maternity benefits under PMMVY are available to the eligible beneficiaries for first living child of family. The Government has approved Pan-India implementation of the PMMVY to cover all the districts of the country.

- (ii) Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP), a comprehensive programme is being implemented to address the declining Child Sex Ratio (CSR) and related issues of empowerment of women over a life-cycle continuum. Since 2018-19, all 640 districts (as per census 2011) of the country have been covered under BBBP scheme. Out of 640 districts, 405 districts are covered through Multi - sectoral intervention, Media & Advocacy; and 235 districts covered through alert Media & Advocacy outreach.
- (iii) Mahila Shakti Kendra scheme (2017-18), empowers rural women through community participation by involvement of Student Volunteers in 115 most backward districts as part of block level initiatives; capacity building of women collectives in 50% of the blocks in the aspirational districts; District Level Centre for Women (DLCW) in 640 districts to facilitate women centric schemes and provide foothold for BBBP scheme; State Resource Centre for Women to support the respective Government in implementation of women centric schemes/programs and BBBP Program.
- (iv) POSHAN Abhiyaan (National Nutrition Mission - NNM) set up by Government on 30.11.2017 with fixed targets to reduce stunting, under-nutrition, anaemia (among young children, women and adolescent girls) and reduce low birth weight by 2%, 2%, 3% and 2% per annum respectively. Mission also strives to achieve reduction in Stunting from 38.4% (NFHS-4) to 25% by 2022 (Mission 25 by 2022).
- (v) One Stop Centres (OSCs) are being established across the country to provide integrated support and assistance under one roof to women affected by violence, both in private and public spaces in a phased manner in all the districts of the country. So far, the Government has given approval for setting up 719 OSCs and 314 OSCs have been set up till now.
- (vi) The Ministry of Women and Child Development (WCD) in collaboration with the Ministry of Home Affairs has envisaged engagement of Mahila Police Volunteers (MPV) in States/UTs who will act as a link between police and community and help women in distress. All the Chief Secretaries of States/UTs have been requested to adopt this initiative in their respective States/UTs.

The Ministry holds regular review meetings with Women and Child Development Departments of State Governments/UT Administrations to discuss the issues for effective implementation of the programmes and schemes to expedite beneficiary coverage and proper fund utilization. Regional level consultations are also held to discuss issues concerning implementation of the schemes. The monitoring reports received from States/UTs are analyzed in the Ministry. The problem areas are communicated to concerned States/UTs for taking corrective actions. In addition, regular State visits are conducted by the Ministry's officials in order to understand the implementation problems being faced by States/UTs. The schemes also have in-built monitoring mechanism to check fund utilisation. Regular follow-up is done by the Ministry and the States/UTs for every sanction of fund. The schemes are also periodically reviewed for their proper and better implementation.

The details of funds released under the schemes are provided at **Annexure I-VII**.
