KVIC SCHEMES

135. SHRI PRATAPRAO JADHAV:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of social objectives of the Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) in the country;
- (b) the details of the areas under the KVIC network including works being taken up by it; and
- (c) the details of special schemes launched by the KVIC till date for making poor and rural people self-reliant in backward areas of the country, State-wise including Maharashtra especially Buldhana?

ANSWER

(a): Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) is a statutory body created by an act of Parliament. The social objective of the KVIC is providing employment in rural as well as urban areas of the country.

(b): KVIC functions with the Central Office, Mumbai in association with 46 State/ Divisional/Sub Offices all over the country, 6 Zonal offices at New Delhi (North Zone), Bhopal (Central Zone), Kolkata (East Zone), Guwahati (North East Zone), Bengaluru (South Zone) and Mumbai (West Zone). 23 Departmental Sales Outlets, 18 Departmental Training Centres, 22 Non-Departmental Training Centres and 6 Central Sliver Plants. In addition to this, 34 State and UT Khadi and Village Industries Boards (KVIBs) and over 8058 Retail Sales Outlets are also functioning.

All Public sectors Banks with a network of more than one lakh branches spread over the country, KVIC, KVIB and DICs are implementing Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme, and other Khadi and Village Industries Schemes are implementing through NGOs, Khadi and V.I. Institutions', units and entrepreneurs spread all over the country.

(c): KVIC implements following schemes for making poor and rural people self-reliant in the country including backward areas of Maharashtra State:

1) Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) is a credit linked subsidy scheme, for setting up of new micro-enterprises and to generate employment opportunities in rural as well as urban areas of the country through KVIC, State Khadi & Village Industries Board (KVIB) and District Industries Centre (DIC). General category beneficiaries can avail of margin money subsidy of 25% of the project cost in rural areas and 15% in urban areas. For beneficiaries belonging to special categories such as SC/ST/Women/PH/Minorities/Ex-Servicemen/NER, the margin money subsidy is 35% in rural areas and 25% in urban areas. The maximum cost of projects is Rs.25 lakh in the manufacturing sector and Rs.10 lakh in the service sector.

Year-wise and State-wise details of Margin Money allocated & utilized, job opportunities created and number of units set up under PMEGP Scheme all over the country, including Maharashtra during 2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18 & 2018-19 (upto 31.12.2018) is placed at **Annexure-I**.

2) **Khadi Programme:** For the development and promotion of Khadi Programme, KVIC implements following Schemes with the support of 34 State/UT Khadi and Village Industries Boards (KVIBs) and 2518 Khadi Institutions:

- i) Market Promotion and Development Assistance (MPDA).
- ii) Interest Subsidy Eligibility Certificate (ISEC)
- iii) AamAdmiBimaYojana (earstwhile Jana Shree BimaYojana)
- iv) Artisans Welfare Fund Trust (AWFT)
- v) Workshed Scheme for Khadi Artisans
- vi) Strengthening of Infrastructure of Existing Weak Khadi Institutions and Assistance for Marketing Infrastructure.

3) **Village Industries Programme** is broadly classified under seven groups for the purpose of implementation of its programmes, which are as under:

- i) Agro Based and Food Processing Industry (ABFPI)
- ii) Forest Based Industry (FBI)
- iii) Hand Made Paper and Fibre Industry (HMPFI)
- iv) Mineral Based Industry (MBI)
- v) Polymer and Chemical Based Industry (PCBI)
- vi) Rural Engineering and Bio-Technology Industry (REBT)
- vii) Service & Textile Industry

4) **Khadi Reform and Development Programme (KRDP)** aims to revitalize the khadi sector with enhanced sustainability of khadi, increased incomes and employment for spinners and weavers, increased artisans' welfare and to achieve synergy with village industries. Under KRDP, restructured amount of US\$ 105 million had been negotiated with Asian Development Bank (ADB) and funds are being provided to the Government of India to be released to KVIC as 'grants-in-aid' under budgetary allocation through the Ministry of MSME. Khadi Reform Package' envisages reform support in the following areas: (i) Artisan Earnings and Empowerment, (ii) Direct Reform Assistance to 400 Khadi Institutions & (iii) Implementation of a well-knit MIS.

5) **Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI)** has been under implementation since 2005-06 for making Traditional Industries more productive and competitive by organizing the Traditional Industries and artisans into clusters. The Scheme envisages providing need-based assistance for replacement of production equipment, setting up of common facility centres (CFC), product development, quality improvement, improved marketing, training and capacity building etc. The scheme was modified as revamped SFURTI scheme during 2016-17.

6) **Capacity Building (CB):** KVIC conducts training programmes through 40 departmental and non-departmental training centres. These training centres impart need-based training under various disciplines viz. Soap and Detergent making, Food Items, Bakery Products, Ready Made Garments, Beekeeping, Agaratti making, candle making, motor winding etc.

7) **Science & Technology:** Research and Development (R&D) is a vital input for stepping up productivity by bringing improvement in equipment and manufacturing techniques of the craftsman. KVIC continued to increase the productivity and earnings of artisans and make the production process more artisan-friendly by reducing drudgery in their work. Various advance technologies have been developed under Research & Development schemes of KVIC, which bring a significant difference in the quality, productivity and packaging of the products manufactured by the rural industries sector.
