Entry of Foreign Institutions

1362. SHRI C. MAHENDRAN:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has laid down a clear path for the entry of foreign institutions into the country with various courses;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has any effective framework to monitor the quality and performance of such international institutions;
- (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether India has a large young population and thus foreign institutions will have an incentive to enter the country and expect benefit from the expertise and reputation of these institutions; and
- (f) if so, the reaction of the Government thereto?

ANSWER

(DR. SATYA PAL SINGH)

(a) to (f): At present, there is no law which allows the entry and operation of foreign educational providers to set up their campuses in India. However, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has notified the UGC (Promotion and Maintenance of Standards of Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Educational Institutions) Regulations 2016, which spell out the modalities regarding the eligibility criteria and the conditions for the collaboration of a foreign educational institution with an Indian educational institution. All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has also set norms for academic collaborations and twinning programmes between Indian and Foreign Universities/Institutions in the field of technical education, research and training in India.
