DEVELOPMENT OF RELIGIOUS PLACES IN TRIBAL AREAS

†217. SHRI ASHOK MAHADEORAO NETE:

Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken/proposes to take any steps to develop religious places Devsthan situated in tribal dominated areas of the country as tourist places especially in Maharashtra:
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to include the religious place of markhanda devsthan in Chamorshi Taluka under Gadchiroli-Chimur parliamentary constituency of Maharashtra in the central list of tourists spots and develop this religious place situated in tribal area as tourist destination; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TOURISM (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) (SHRI K.J. ALPHONS)

(a) & (b): Development of religious places is the responsibility of respective State Governments/Union Territories. Ministry of Tourism, under the schemes viz., Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual, Heritage Augmentation Drive (PRASHAD) and "Integrated Development of Theme Based Tourist Circuit in the Country, Swadesh Darshan (SD)" only provides Central Financial Assistance for infrastructure development and beautification of tourist spots on receipt of suitable DPRs submitted by State Governments/Union Territories, subject to availability of funds, liquidation of pending utilisation certificate against the fund released earlier and

adherence to the relevant scheme guidelines. However, details of places/destinations selected for development including Tribal dominated areas under PRASHAD Scheme of the Ministry, in consultation with the respective State Governments is annexed.

(c) & (d): No such proposal for development of religious place in tribal dominated areas in Maharashtra including Markhanda Devsthan in Chamorshi Taluk under Gadchiroli –Chimur Parliamentary Constituency of Maharashtra has been received from State Government of Maharashtra. However, for the State of Maharashtra, Ministry of Tourism has approved the project "Development of Trimbakeshwar" in the year 2017-18 at the cost of Rs.37.81 Crore under PRASHAD Scheme.
