#### **DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE**

#### No. 295 SHRI NIHAL CHAND:

Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has achieved/likely to achieve the target of 100% scientific processing and disposal of solid waste by 2019 under the Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban);
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the action being taken by the Government to achieve this target?

#### **ANSWER**

# THE MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) OF THE MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS

### (SHRI HARDEEP SINGH PURI)

- (a): The target of Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban (SBM-U) is to achieve 100% scientific processing and disposal of solid waste by 02 October 2019. At present, about 50% of solid municipal waste generated is being processed.
- (b) and (c): At present the total Solid Waste generation is 1,45,128 Metric Tonne (MT) per day, of which 72,839.74 MT per day is being processed, which is about 50 percent.

Government has undertaken various steps to achieve the target of 100% processing of municipal solid waste, which include, hand-holding support to the States/Urban Local Bodies (ULBs); release of 35% of the project cost as Central share funds; issuing of advisories, books and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) on various aspects of solid waste management; conducting Capacity Building (CB) training workshops in all cities; mass publicity campaign in various media platform; conducting 'Swachh Survekshan' survey to rank cities on various sanitation and cleanliness parameters; launching of 'Star Rating' protocol for garbage free cities, to motivate cities to achieve garbage free status; launching of ODF, ODF+ and ODF++ protocols to ensure sustenance on ODF outcomes and achieving holistic sanitation; etc.
