### **454. SHRIMATI KIRRON KHER:**

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken steps to implement the recommendations of the report of National Requirement of Manpower for 8-hours shift in Police Stations published by the Bureau of Police Research and Development in 2014;
- (b) if so, the steps taken towards implementation of the said recommendations; and
- (c) the list of police departments and police commissionerates which have introduced an 8-hour shift system, State-wise?

#### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI HANSRAJ GANGARAM AHIR)

(a) to (c): Yes, Madam. According to a study done by Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI), Hyderabad, sponsored by Bureau of Police Research & Development in August 2014, nearly 90% of police Station staff, across the States and across various police stations, presently work for more than 8 hours a day. A copy of study report was forwarded to DGPs of all States/UTs for appropriate action. "Police" is a State subject falling in List-II (State List) of the Seventh Schedule of the Constitution of India. It is primarily for the State Governments to implement various reform measures.
