## **Details regarding HSS Yojana**

## 771. SHRI ASHOK SHANKARRAO CHAVAN:

Will the Minister of TEXTILES वस्त्र मंत्री be pleased to state;

- (a) whether the Government had launched Hathkargha Samvardhan Sahayata (HSS) Yojana for handloom weavers;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the aims and objectives thereto;
- (c) the ratio of sharing of financial assistance between the Government and beneficiary;
- (d) the total financial assistance provided by the Government under the HSS Yojana, till date, State/UT-wise:
- (e) the number of handloom weavers benefited from the HSS, till date, State/UT-wise; and
- (f) the monitoring mechanism developed by the Government in this regard?

## उत्तर ANSWER वस्त्र राज्य मंत्री (श्री अजय टम्टा) THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR TEXTILES (SHRI AJAY TAMTA)

- (a) & (b) The Government of India, Ministry of Textiles introduced the technology up-gradation scheme under National Handloom Development Programme (NHDP) and Comprehensive Handloom Cluster Development Scheme (CHCDS) in 2015-16. The technology up-gradation scheme, with some modifications, was named as "Hathkargha Samvardhan Sahayata (HSS) Yojana" in December 2016, for providing upgraded looms/accessories to handloom weavers to improve quality of fabric and enhance productivity. HSS is voluntary scheme option, available for weavers for receiving support.
- (c) Under the Yojana, the Government of India bears 90% of the cost of looms/accessories & remaining 10% is borne by the beneficiary.
- (d)&(e) A statement showing State-wise total financial assistance provided and the number of handloom weavers benefited till date is at Annexure-I.
- (f) The scheme is monitored at different levels by Government of India and State Government.
