However, the Hon'ble Minister of Road Transport & Highways has initiated Skill Development Program under RPL(Recognition of Prior Learning) scheme to train Construction Workers in Highway Sector in the year 2016 through DG(Training)(Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship) in respect of Highway Projects costing more than Rs.100 Crores. Guidelines to this effect have been issued. Under this program, till date, 95000 workmen have been registered, 82000 workmen have been trained in the 6 trades (Masonry, Bar bending, Scaffolding, Shuttering/ Carpentry, Plumbing and Painting).
