(a) & (b) Yes Sir.

Consequent to the floods in 2018 in Kerala, State Government of Kerala has made an assessment of the losses suffered by dairy industry.

(c) and (d) State Government of Kerala submitted a project proposal with an outlay of Rs. 54.81 crore during 2018-19 to Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying & Fisheries (now Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying), Government of India,in order to support and recoup the losses in the dairy sector. The proposal sought central assistance of Rs. 39.34 crore under Central Sector Scheme, National Programme for Dairy Development (NPDD). This Department has sanctioned the project under NPDD on 20.11.2018 at a total project outlay of Rs.44.03 crore and with central share of Rs.33.03 Crore. The project is being implemented by Kerala Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation, Kerala (MILMA). An amount of Rs. 10.74 crore as first instalment has been released to MILMA on 20.11.2018.
