- (b) the details of identification of a core set of research challenges that address issues of affordability, prevention and care of cancer;
- (c) the details of the total research funding for the initiative along with details of outcome as on date;
- (d) whether the Government hospitals are ill equipped to meet the massive burden of escalating cancer care costs, if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) whether the Government is likely to focus on low cost approaches to cancer treatment and if so, the details thereof

- III. Oncology focus in new All India Institutes of Medical Sciences and upgraded institutions under Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojna (PMSSY)
- IV. A new National Cancer Institute at Jhajjar, Haryana.
- V. Affordable Medicines and Reliable Implants for Treatment (AMRIT) Deendayal outlets have been opened at 159 Institutions/Hospitals to make available medicines and transplants at discounted price.
