FUNDING PROJECTS FOR STATES TO CONTROL CANCER

1259. SHRI NALIN KUMAR KATEEL:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has any new funding projects for the States to control cancer and cancer related diseases;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the total amount allocated for the said purpose during the last three years, State/UT-wise; and
- (d) the steps taken by the Government to provide timely and adequate supply of low cost drugs and medicines for the cure of cancer and cancer related diseases under "National Programme for Prevention and Control of Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases & Stroke"?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)

- (a) to (d): The Central Government supplements the efforts of the State Governments to prevent and control cancer. Some of the steps taken by Central Government are as follows:
 - I. The objectives of National Programme for Prevention and Control of Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases and Stroke (NPCDCS) being implemented under National Health Mission (NHM) for interventions upto the district level include awareness generation for Cancer prevention, screening, early detection and referral to an appropriate level institution for treatment. For Cancer, the focus is on three Cancers namely breast, cervical and oral. NPCDCS has been subsumed under NCD Flexi pool of NHM from the year 2015-16 onwards. The State/UT-wise detail of funds released under NCD Flexi pool during last three years is at **Annexure-I.**
 - II. A population level initiative for prevention, control and screening for common Non-Communicable Diseases (diabetes, hypertension and cancers viz. oral, breast and cervical cancer) has been rolled out in over 215 districts of the country under NHM, as a part of comprehensive primary healthcare.

- III. To enhance the facilities for tertiary care of cancer, the Central Government is implementing Strengthening of Tertiary Care Cancer facilities scheme to support setting up of State Cancer Institutes (SCI) and Tertiary Care Cancer Centres (TCCC) in different parts of the country. The details of SCI and TCCC approved under the scheme and the funds released as 1st instalment of Central share to State Governments for setting up of SCI and TCCC, State/UT-wise is at **Annexure-II.**
- IV. Oncology in its various aspects has focus in case of new AIIMS and many upgraded institutions under Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojna (PMSSY).
- V. Setting up of National Cancer Institute (NCI) at Jhajjar (Haryana) and Second campus of Chittaranjan National Cancer Institute, Kolkata has been approved.
- VI. The Government is providing financial assistance to patients living below poverty line for life threatening diseases under the schemes such as Rashtriya Arogya Nidhi (RAN), Health Minister's Cancer Patient Fund (HMCPF) and Health Minister's Discretionary Grant (HMDG).
- VII. Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojna (PMJAY) provides for benefit coverage of Rs. 5,00,000/- to over more than 10 crore beneficiary families, giving cashless access to services for the beneficiary at the point of service in empanelled hospitals (both public and private) across India. More than 1350 medical packages have been finalized by an expert committee. The treatment of cancer is also included under PMJAY.
- VIII. Support for drugs is provided under National Health Mission as per their Programme Implementation Plan. NPCDCS is implemented under NHM umbrella.
 - IX. Affordable Medicines and Reliable Implants for Treatment (AMRIT) Deendayal outlets have been opened at 158 Institutions/Hospitals with an objective to make available Cancer and Cardiovascular Diseases drugs and implants at discounted prices to the patients. Jan Aushadhi stores are set up by Department of Pharmaceuticals to provide generic drugs at affordable prices.
